What is a Portrait?

A portrait is usually an image of a person, a group of people, pets or animals. Images can be made in different ways using various mediums.

For example, before photography, portraits of people were either painted or sculpted.



Photography gained popularity in the late 1800's. With the ability to produce images cheaper and faster than painting or sculpture, photography became the medium of choice for people who wanted to get a portrait done.

Photographs could also capture images of big groups together and soon everyone was getting their family photograph taken. Have you seen some of these portraits in old photo albums?

Portraits don't just capture a person's looks, they also reflect their personality, status, and interests. Portraits can also capture a person's emotions like grief, happiness, and hope.

ACTIVITY

Try using your mobile phone camera to take a portrait photograph of someone you know. Consider the theme you want to capture, for example, themes like celebration, fear, happiness, surprise.

- Who is your subject? Is it a portrait of just **one** person or does it feature **many** people?
